

Recognizing the to provide immediate help challenges that victims face in recovering from natural or man-made calamities, Senator Alan Peter Cayetano is pushing for his proposal to provide immediate assistance to families that have lost their properties and livelihoods as a result of disasters.

According Cayetano, individuals affected by natural or human-caused disasters such as floods, storms, typhoons, fires, or earthquakes should receive financial aid from the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD). "This measure

proposes to strengthen the 4Ps [Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program] Law to aid our kababayan placed in unfortunate situations without their fault, such as in disasters." he said in his Explanatory Note to Senate Bill No. 302 or the 4Ps for Disaster Victims Act.

He formally filed the proposal on July 18 last year. On April 23 (Tuesday), the proposal will be deliberated within the Committee on Social Justice, Welfare, and Rural Development.
