

mittance of monthly premiums will ensure that JO workers are qualified to avail of SSS benefits and loan privileges in times of emergencies," Macasaet

He explained that JO workers as self-employed members, could avail of SSS benefits like sickness, maternity, disability, retirement, death, and funeral. "They can also avail of loan privi-leges such as salary and calamity loans."

In addition to SSS benefits, he added that they are entitled to receive Employees' Compensation (EC) benefits in case of work-connected sickness, injury, or death.
