6. Check your blood pressure regularly

Hypertension, or high blood pressure, is : called a "silent killer". This is because many people who have hypertension may not be aware of the problem as it may not have any symptoms. If left uncontrolled, hypertension can lead to heart, brain, kidney and other diseases. Have your blood pressure checked regularly by a health worker so you: know your numbers. If your blood pressure is high. get the advice of a health worker. This is vital in the prevention and control of hypertension.

7. Follow traffic laws

Road crashes claim over one million lives around the world and millions more are injured. Road traffic injuries are preventable through a variety of measures implemented by the government such as strong legislation and enforcement, safer infrastructure and vehicle standards, and improved post-crash care. You yourself can also prevent road crashes by ensuring that you follow traffic laws such : as using the seatbelt for adults and child restraint for vour kids, wearing a helmet when riding a motorcycle or bicycle, not drinking and driving, and not using your mobile phone while driving.

8. Take antibiotics only as prescribed

Antibiotic resistance is one of the biggest public health threats in our generation. When antibiotics lose their power, bacterial infections become harder to treat, leading to higher medical costs, prolonged hospital stays, and increased mortality. Antibiotics are losing their power because of misuse and overuse in humans and animals. Make sure you only take antibiotics if prescribed by a qualified health professional. And once prescribed, complete the treatment days as instructed. Never share antibi-

9. Clean your hands properly

Hand hygiene is critical not only for health workers but for everyone. Clean hands can prevent the spread of infectious illnesses. You should handwash using soap and water when your hands are visibly soiled or handrub using an alcohol-based product.

10. Have regular check-ups

Regular check-ups can help find health problems before they start. Health professionals can help find and diagnose health issues early, when \$ your chances for treatment and cure are better. Go to your nearest health facility to check out the health services, screenings and treatment that are accessible to you.

According to the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Calabarzon, which chairs the RDRRMC, local DRRMCs have been urged to implement the minimum preparedness checklist, strengthen information, education, and communication (IEC) campaigns, and preposition relief goods in anticipation of possible emergencies.

OCD Calabarzon Regional Director Eduardo Carlos Alvarez also advised local DRRMCs to identify and inspect evacuation centers to ensure that residents can be safely relocated when neces-

With these initiatives, Alvarez emphasized the importance of continued coordination with local municipalities in the region to ensure a swift response during disasters.

REMULLA REPORTS SIGNIFICANT DROP IN FOCUS CRIMES IN FIRST HALF OF 2025

retary Jonvic C. Remulla reported a significant drop in focus crimes, including physical injuries, and robbery, from January 1 to June 6 this year, compared to the same period

Focus crimes are considered serious offenses that occur frequently and directly impact public

During the 1st Joint National Peace and Order Council and Regional Peace and Order (NPOC-RPOC) Council Meeting, Remulla said rape incidents went down by 31.85%, physical injuries by 30.21%, and robbery by 26.47%.

Remulla, who is also the NPOC Chairperson, highlighted that the campaign against loose firearms resulted in the confiscation of 12,891 illegal firearms and the arrest of 5.314 individuals, 4.096 of whom are now facing charges in court.

returned to the Senate in 2022, filed a total of 45 bills during the 19th Congress, 28 of which he principally authored. He also sponsored a total of 20 bills on the Senate floor. Three of these

have already been enacted into law, including Republic Act No. 12180 or the PHIVOLCS Modernization Act which seeks to enhance the agency's capacity to detect seismic activity by upgrading equipment, increasing the number of seismic stations, and improving the salaries and training of
